

[Hungarian portion of letter dated 31 March 1940]

Dear son,

The rest of the small space I will just use to give you some news about us. Kereny called us because she said she got some news from her son and from you and she was eager to tell us what's happening. Although she didn't say anything new I still really appreciate her kindness as a mother and also her son as well.

Rotter is trying to involve a teacher in the vitamin business in regards to clinical tests, in the hope that those certificates will be much easier to get. This teacher is in medicine and the hope is that with his assistance this invention will be easier to place here. If everything goes in the right direction, hopefully within a few weeks we can talk about it.

Regarding your request about the position of stamps on the letters, I will try to do that. But I need to say that of course I am equally as excited as your mum about your activities. Just please tell us everything that is happening with you in as much detail as you can. Other than the disgusting political situation, my life is extremely uneventful and it is just so exciting to read about exciting things on the other side of the globe and for a few moments I forget that it is all happening to you and I imagine that I myself am there on the other side of the globe and that is a fantastic feeling, so please support it.
